Whereas:

- i. The Arts & Sciences Curriculum Committee recognizes the need to avoid conflicts of interest as much as possible in order to best advise the curricular activities of its constituent units and schools, in line with University and SUNY policies. However, because the A&SCC is composed of representatives from units that carry out course instruction of curricula reviewed by this committee, it would be impossible to be absolutely free from all appearance of conflict. The best committees such as this can do is to mitigate actual and apparent conflicts to the extent possible.
- ii. The A&S Senate and University Senate at large do not have an existing conflict of interest policy for standing committees.
- iii. A&SCC meetings have been and will continue to be conducted in accordance with A&S Senate By-Laws. Of particular note, Article 11§2 specifically exempts the Curriculum Committee from the requirement of having voting members with discussed and voted business needing to "absent themselves." In addition, we have adopted a higher standard of not assigning focused review by relevant committee members.

Be it resolved that:

iv. Until a uniform conflict of interest policy is adopted by the Senate structure for all standing committees, the A&SCC continue to follow the general guideline in the A&S Senate By-Laws.

- v. Voting committee members will not be assigned to review, comment on, or provide technical feedback on submissions stemming from specific programs, departments, or units in which they teach or administer.
- vi. Voting committee members will not be required to abstain from discussion in order to provide context. Discussion of curricular business is enriched by the participation and disciplinary and contextual knowledge of relevant committee members and invited University guests, who are often invited.
- vii. Voting committee members will abstain from voting on any curricular proposal that relates to specific programs, departments, or units in which they teach or administer.
- viii. In instances where the abstention of a voting committee member reduces the number of votes below the required quorum, then the proposed business item will be tabled until the following A&SCC meeting, or the next opportunity when the committee attendance is able to reach quorum without committee members from relevant units. If quorum becomes technically impossible when adopting the above process, the Chair shall seek the advice of the A&S Senate President.

Task Revision - Change in Delivery–LCS–UKR 111 Elementary Ukrainian I	Revise and Resubmit Dear Dr. Jourdain, On behalf of the Arts & Sciences Curriculum Committee, I am writing to inform you that your request for change of delivery for UKR 111 was voted as "revise and resubmit." Because there are a number of issues that need to be addressed in the syllabus submitted, we ask the instructor to review and address all relevant items in the checklist here . Please address issues including, but not limited to, the following: • Remove "Skill 3" from the top of the syllabus. The Diversified Education Curriculum (DEC) was superseded in 2014 by the Stony Brook Curriculum (SBC). If this course is intended to fulfill the LANG SBC requirement, it must include the two LANG learning objectives. This can be added in its own section above/below the Course Learning Objectives, titled something along the lines of "Stony Brook Curriculum Learning Objectives (LANG)." The two LANG LOs should be copied verbatim. • Some aspects of curricular alignment need to be included. The grading scheme is clear, but not all the components of it are described in the syllabus. • Class attendance & participation: described in "How to Succeed in this Course," no changes necessary • Written assignments: you provided a point rubric for this, and generally indicated that this is a tentative syllabus. Could you provide a brief description of what might be expected of students to complete for these
	writing assignments? Readings & Dialogues: please include a short description of how these

- readings and dialogues will be administered.
- Audio, Video, Talks: described in "How to submit assignments," no changes necessary
- Midterm and Final: described in the course schedule, no changes necessary.

Changes recommended for course clarity and accessibility:

- We recognize that some of the text and highlighting was to draw the committee's attention to additions for this revision. However, certain formatting choices on the syllabus are not advisable for digital accessibility: some examples include red text on yellow background and tables with both merged and unmerged cells. We strongly recommend reviewing CELT's Digital Accessibility Resources for tutorials and tools on how to best design and format your syllabus to maximize digital accessibility—especially because this course is proposed for online instruction.
- VoiceThread is mentioned as a tool that will be used for the course, but no additional details are given. We recommend including some language about that tool for students that may not be familiar, or may need additional guidance. CELT has a sample syllabus statement for this under their "Sample Statements" section.
- Clarify the "Fri Recitation" items listed in the "Homework to Submit on Date" column of the course schedule. Does this mean that the weekly recitation assignments are due on Fridays? If so, those specific dates should be listed and perhaps clarify the text to say "Week 1 recitation assignment," or something similar.
- Demonstrating curricular alignment by describing the forms of assessment were outlined above in the required changes. These descriptions are spread throughout the syllabus, and it was difficult for us as a committee to locate all these individual components. We recommend creating a separate section and calling it something like "Course Assessments" where you can relocate some of these existing descriptions for the graded components and add descriptions for the items that are not fully described. This would allow students to see in one section all the different ways they will be assessed in the course (and not simply the grade break down of those assessments towards their final grade)

On behalf of the Arts & Sciences Curriculum Committee, I am writing to inform you that your proposal for AAS/KOR2xx was voted as "revise and resubmit."

The committee has reviewed the resubmitted syllabus for AAS/KOR 2xx Korean American Literature and recommends another revision and resubmission. There has been substantial improvement from the first submission, but there are a few major items that hold this syllabus back from approval. They are:

- Course-specific learning objectives need to be reworked. As they are currently written, they are not measurable and it is difficult to determine how they will be assessed. CELT has a helpful self-paced guide on how to <u>create learning objectives</u>.
- Course alignment must be demonstrated for each of the course learning outcomes and SBC learning outcomes. Currently it is not apparent how the SBC learning objectives and course-specific learning outcomes are aligned. We recommend making an appointment with a CELT Instructional Designer to advise the best way to make adjustments to your syllabus. It is possible that they are connected in the course the way you have designed it, but this must be articulated through course alignment.
- The course description seems too specific and may need to be broadened. Listing the specific number of books, poems, and short stories could prove restrictive in the future. The A&SCC has a course description style guide that you can reference here.

I am writing with regard to the Curriculum Committee's email to you, approving edits to the bulletin for the sample BS and BA sequences in Undergraduate Bio, on 2/17/2024. Unfortunately, we had made an oversight in the Committee's standard review process. Because there are a number of issues that need to be addressed in the syllabus submitted, we ask the instructor to review and address all relevant items in the checklist <u>here</u>. Please address issues including, but not limited to, the following:

- Add ARTS SLO verbatim and demonstrate how it is met. For instance, more clarity on the grading scheme is needed: the instructor mentions that the final paper may be "weighed slightly more and the first paper slightly less" despite indicating that all 3 papers are worth the same (25% each); this is likely to create confusion and inequity for the students (how does the student know for sure what percentage each paper is worth?).
- Match the course description in the syllabus with the bulletin.
- Explicitly state the pre-requisite information, course modality and mode of instruction
- Include tentative dates in course schedule for major assessment components (due dates of papers).

- Update required syllabus statements.
- Consult the CELT syllabus template and CC checklist.
- Add department, SBCs, credits, modality/mode, verbatim course description, matching title.
- Include SBC LOs verbatim.
- Add a grading scheme and scale.
- Update required course policies.
- Include technology statements not included.
- Add specificity about grade impact in absence policy. Notes do not need to come from the Dean, but from the Student Support Team.

Some reviewers had strongly suggested a "revise and resubmit" recommendation, but others considered the "urgent" situation and helped to find a pathway toward an "approve with notes" and I wanted to support the latter suggestion with the promise to the other colleagues that I would capture all their suggestions. I hope you can support the instructor update the course to include required curricular information and meet the rigor we typically maintain through the review: • Add office hours per university policy on minimal instructional responsibility. In many ways, this is a solid syllabus. It includes the appropriate university statements, assignments are effectively described, and the course schedule is clear enough. But: Office hours cannot be by appointment only. At least three hours must be scheduled. • Copy the same course description from Undergraduate Bulletin (instructors can add new details as needed).
	 Add other essential course information: Department; SBC designation; office hours and location; SASC statement (wrong office location). Update CLOs to make them more measurable, also updating the syllabus for showing curricular alignment more clearly. Also, consider distinguishing course goals and learning objectives (see note below from a reviewer). List an SBC LOs verbatim on the syllabus. The syllabus doesn't do this even though, according to the undergraduate <u>bulletin</u>, this course satisfies STAS. The <u>learning outcomes</u> for STAS should be listed verbatim. Instead, this syllabus lists generic "general education outcomes." Recommended (not based on official policy/guideline): We don't have an official position on profanity in a syllabus (see "shit happens clause")? We suggest that the instructor take a second look at this. Recommended: Be explicit about the use of Chicago style citing, ideally providing a link <u>Chicago-Style Citation Quick Guide (chicagomanualofstyle.org)</u> We will request an update to the bulletin based on the approval. We hope you will get the above recommendation implemented before the course syllabus is provided to students.
