HRM 595 Project Seminar

- Goal is to teach students to understand and conduct graduate-level research.
- At least 25 pages in length; APA formatted.
- Must earn a "B" or higher to count toward degree.
- Students will be guided in selecting a topic for their research paper.
- Prerequisite: 24 credit hours
- Get a head start! Start using a reference management program like Zotero or EndNote now (more on this later).

HRM 585 Internship (optional)

- Students who are not working in the field may choose to gain field experience by completing a one-credit internship practicum over and above the requirements for the Master of Science degree
- A minimum of 45 hours of work is required in a setting that is outside of the your current area of employment.
- The Career Center maintains an internship database.
- Students must obtain approval from the program director to enroll in this S/U graded course.

Planning Your Course of Study

- MS students have five years to complete the degree.
- Four courses (12 credits) maximum per term but the recommendation is two for working students.
- Students should take HRM 532 and HRM 533 early on in their course of study.



Planning Your Course of Study (cont'd)

- On-campus courses are offered less frequently than online courses.
- International students or those students who are receiving financial assistance may have requirements in terms of modality or course load.

Scheduling Overview

- Online classes: 10-week terms that start at beginning of Fall, Spring and Summer I *
- Face-to-face classes:
 - Fall and Spring: Class meets for 3 hours once per week for 15 weeks
 - Summer I and II: Classes meet for 3.5 hours twice a week for 6 weeks
- Winter session courses last 3 weeks

^{*}Except for HRM 595, which meets for the full 15 weeks

Expectations

Academic Expectations

- Be an active participant in the classroom.
- Meet all assignment deadlines.
- Focus on the quality of your writing including content, citations, sentence structure, grammar, and spelling.
- Maintain good academic standing with a minimum GPA of 3.0 (graduate, cumulative and in the program)
- Read and understand SPD's Academic Honesty Policy listed in the Bulletin.

Academic Honesty

- Cornerstone of all academic and scholarly work.
- Minimum penalty is an "F" in the course and suspension for one term for students found responsible for academic dishonesty.
- Often, accused students did not know how to properly cite their sources (but they are still held responsible).
- Consider attending our Citation Skills Workshop in August or viewing one of our recorded workshops posted on the SPD Library Guide website: guides.library.stonybrook.edu/spd/home

Online Learning at SPD

- Asynchronous seminars conducted via Blackboard
- All students are required to participate at least three different days during the week
- Requires careful reading and considerable amount of writing in discussion boards

Common Enrollment Blocks (or Holds)

- Proof of Health Insurance
- Signing the Financial Responsibility Statement
- Enrollment in SB Alert
- Proof of MMR immunization

When To Enroll

- Enroll as soon as you are eligible and according to your enrollment appointment.
- Summer and Fall enrollment begins in early April.
- Winter and Spring enrollment begins in early November.
- Clear up any blocks you may have before registration begins.

A Word About Waitlists

- The majority of online courses will eventually fill.
- If the course you want is full, add your name to the waitlist. If someone drops, you will be enrolled automatically.
- Monitor your position and make schedule adjustments.
- Waitlist problems? Contact SPD Online.
- Note: You are financially responsible for any course for which you are enrolled via the waitlist, so please double-check your schedule before the end of the tuition liability period.

A Word About Cancellations

- SPD does not run courses with fewer than 10 students.
- Enroll early we start cancelling underenrolled courses about four weeks prior to the start of class.
- Check the enrollment in your course by clicking on the course's title in SOLAR.
- If the course is still underenrolled four weeks prior to the start of class, consider adding a second course as a back-up.





- There are benefits and drawbacks to ordering from the campus bookstore.





Databases for News Articles

- LexisNexis Academic
- Date coverage varies. Fulltext. Over 10,000 news, business, and legal sources. News coverage includes deep backfiles and up-to-the-minute stories in national and regional newspapers, wire services, broadcast transcripts, international news, and non-English language sources.
- Newsday

Newsday. Nassau edition from 08/15/1985 to present. Find articles covering the Friedmans' story.

Ethnic NewsWatch

1990-present. Fulltext. Articles from newspapers and periodicals published by ethnic, minority and native presses in the United States. In English and Spanish.

HR Recommended Databases

· Business Source Complete

Coverage dates vary, in some cases as far back as 1886. Selected full text. This scholarly business database includes indexing and abstracts for the most important scholarly business journals.

· Academic Search Complete

Date coverage varies, back to 1887. Scholarly, multi-disciplinary database. Covers over 6100 fulltext journals, 5100 peer reviewed journals, and indexing for over 10,000 journals. Non-journal publications are also indexed.

ERIC (Education Resources Information Center)

1966-present. Abstracts to journal articles and over 300,000 full text Education Documents (EDs). Additional EDs are available on microfiche. Includes visual searching feature.

MEDLINE (ISI Web of Knowledge)

1950-present. Medicine, nursing, dentistry, veterinary medicine, the health care system, pre-clinical sciences, etc. Uses MeSH (Medical Subject Headings) indexing with tree, tree hierarchy, subheadings and explosion capabilities to search citations from over 4,800 current biomedical journals. Created by the National Library of Medicine.

· Professional Development Collection

1965-present. Fulltext, abstracts and citations. Subjects include Curriculum Administration, Educational Leadership and Research, Learning Disabilities, Reading and School Libraries. Over 550 high quality education journals, 350 peer-reviewed. Includes visual searching features.

PsycINFO

1887-present. Citations and abstracts to articles from over 2,000 journals, as well as books, dissertations, and reports on psychology and related disciplines.

PsycARTICLES

Date coverage varies, mostly 1985-present. Fulltext, citations and abstracts. Covers general psychology and specialized basic, applied, clinical, and theoretical research in psychology in areas including animal behavior, cognition, memory, neuroscience, perception, physiological psychology, psychology, psychology, social and personality psychology.

ScienceDirect Journals

1995 - present. Fulltext access for nearly 2,000 scholarly journals. Citations and abstracts prior to 1995 and for journals outside of SBU's fulltext subscription. Covers all disciplines with emphasis in the sciences (including medicine) and social sciences.

Conference Board: Business Knowledge Research

1998-present. Research Reports on key business and economic topics such as executive compensation annual studies. Includes the Conference Board Review magazine


Coverage begins with the first issue of a journal, some as early as the 1600s, and continues up until 1-to-5 years ago. An online archive of core scholarly journals in most fields of study. Comprised of high-resolution, scanned images of journal issues and pages as they were originally designed, printed, and illustrated. Not a source for recent articles.


